Has Gihon Begun?

On January 8, we held our first teaching when Jim McManus and I traveled to Rongo in hopes of the latter rain. This was also the opening of the newly completed 800-capacity Bride Hall. But our previously planned January 7 teaching had to be moved to the eighth because of a delayed flight that got me into Kenya one day later. And wonderfully, this January 8 teaching was the greatest meeting Bride has ever had, and was even more wonderful by holding it in the newly completed Bride Hall.

Caleb and the brothers were hoping for 800 attendees, which would be a full house. But it did not turn out that way. Instead, it was a double portion of 1,600! Caleb was amazed as bus after bus, and even large trucks packed full with people, pulled onto the property with souls eager to hear the truth. And despite the quota set by authorities due to the pandemic, they did not stop them. And wonderfully, a newly established church in Rongo rushed over another 400 chairs, as well as two tents, so as to provide some shade for the overflow. And we also set up another loudspeaker outside so they could hear better. Those who came to learn were from Tanzania and southwest Kenya, and around 70% of them were hearing Bride truth for the first time. And they all marveled and rejoiced!

I have been teaching Bride going on twenty-seven years, and in Kenya for five years, and there has never been a more profitable and exciting meeting. The overflowing crowd was more than ready to learn, and were in hearty agreement with what they heard. However, because of travel obligations for the people, I was limited to just over two hours of teaching; but the response was wonderful! You can watch the teaching here, and I was quite enthusiastic. Bless Yahweh! (Unfortunately, because we had to use the mike on the camera, you can get a clearer audio by listening with headphones.)

And let us keep in mind something that affords understanding and hope. When we consider the latter rain, we of course think of Gihon, the second river that branched out of Eden. While the first river, Pishon, speaks of the former rain, it is Gihon that is the latter rain. And Gihon means "bursting forth." Click here to read more concerning this. But even with this powerful name, we find something MOST revealing and important about that much needed river and its outcome.

The literal Gihon flowed out of the ground in Jerusalem, and immediately passed underground through Hezekiah's tunnel. Then, nearly 1,800 feet later it emerged to become the waters of the Pool of Siloam. And what is the specific testimony of that final pool? Even as the man who was blind from birth was given sight at that pool (John 9), so it is today the Gihon outpouring of the Spirit where we who have been blind from "birth," for two thousand years, can now begin to see what Yahweh God is truly doing.

And this opening of eyes is exactly what took place at that teaching here in Africa. **Their blinded eyes were opened** to see what Yahweh God is truly doing today! And this is nothing less than the evidence that the Gihon waters of the latter rain of Spirit are indeed at hand—opening our blinded eyes to see for the very first time in the history of man. Amen!

I am getting this Report off to you now, and will follow up with more, in His time. We have eight teachings arranged for the next five days, and the people are eager to hear—unlike elsewhere.
